



## Guest Speaker: **James March** CEO Barossa Wine and Grape Association

James and his team has successfully launched a TV and screen advertisement for the Barossa which won an international award at Cannes this year.

The idea behind their efforts being to get world awareness for the Barossa so that it has the same recognition as other wine producing regions such as Champagne, Bordeaux, Burgundy and the Nappa Valley. So the connection was made between the wine, the food and the heritage of the Barossa region for the world promotion.

James screened the full advertisement which won the award. All those present were highly impressed with it and agreed it created the link with the wine of the region and the overall experience of the Barossa.

This was despite only a few actual references to wine during the advertisement; the emphasis being placed on, among other things, the scenery, the people, the heritage, the history, etc.

The Barossa has some of the oldest continuously producing vineyards in the world and with names like Grange and Henschke Hill of Grace, produce world class wines which consistently win international awards.

Barossa Tourism has created its own regional "mark" with the slogan 'Barossa – Our Promise Kept' and must be earned by those in the region who wish to use it for their own promotion and marketing.

Companies can earn it based on: origin, integrity, quality, environment and community.

There seems no doubt that the Barossa will get the world wide recognition it deserves.

This was a great lunch with 30 in attendance which included 7 visitors!

## Guest Speaker: **Yu Tianyun** topic **Doing Business with China**

Yu talked about the implications in business with the understanding of the Chinese language.

Generally speaking the Chinese population speaks 'mandarin'. Each region has its own dialect. The most familiar dialect is Cantonese. It is difficult for one dialect to speak and understand another dialect. The need for people from one region speaking to another within China, is that at times they need a person who can speak both dialects.

The English language is alphabetic, the Chinese language (when written) is visual characters. Potentially from a range of 60,000 – 100,000 characters.

Names have meanings. When asking Ashleigh if he knew what his name meant, he was unaware of a meaning. Yu responded his own name meant melody and sky. This is common in the Chinese culture for the name to be selected based on its meaning. (By-The-Way Ashleigh, the old English name means a 'dweller near the ash tree forest'.)

Some English words are used in the modern Chinese conversation. Such as the word Google, over 40% Chinese refer to the word in its English pronunciation. 56% of Chinese wanted 'google' to identify a Chinese name for the company name. The name offered used the characters meaning: "harvest sun" where harvest means hope, wealth and money.

Names are embedded with a deep significance.

Some other examples shared today were:

**Precious house** for the car company **BMW**

**Happiness and power** for **Heiniken**

**Enduring and preserving** for **Nike**


**Tasty, fun** for **Coke Cola**

It's important to brand your name doing business in China.

Many of the characters are pronounced the same, like the word for death 'si' is also the same pronunciation for the number '4'. Four is considered an unlucky number in China, as is fourteen. So often in buildings there is no fourth floor.

Eight is a lucky number. The Olympics opened in the eight month on the eight day, at eight o'clock.

Similarly, the issue with the word **Bing** when used as the internet search engine name as **Bing** means disease or virus.

It is recommended to stick to the English word until you learn more about the Chinese language and culture. So if booking into a Chinese restaurant you may need to book for 3+ 1 people not four.


